



Disciplinary Policies 'Choices and Strategies'

Children will be given the opportunity to explore areas of personal interests based on their age appropriate and developmental stage. Each individual child is assessed quarterly. Based on those findings and quarterly parent teacher conferences, SELC designs an Individual Educational Plan (IEP) designated for the individual child's needs.

Examples of an IEP might include:

- For children with disciplinary concerns, SELC employs positive behavior correcting methods that will redirect negative behavior
- Give a comfort toy
- Teacher - Child Activity of the child's choice
- (Examples: Reading their favorite story, playing their favorite game, or an art activity. All options will incorporate appropriate behavior solutions through child's play and understanding.)
- Visit the classroom comfy calming corner
- Teacher and Community Helper
- Partner with a classmate
- Goal charts: Earn praise, prize, or activity rewards
- Teacher acknowledging good behavior
- Daily and/or weekly reports which support positive partnerships between parents and teachers

We ask you to support us in role modeling positive behavior with all the children in the program. Please do not use developmentally inappropriate language or discipline measures at the program.
